# Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority Ridership Report – May 2022

### **Summary**

- The COVID-19 pandemic continued to affect ridership
- System ridership in May 2022 was 1.6 million, representing 29% more riders than in May 2021
  - o Average fixed route weekday was 31% higher<sup>1</sup>
  - o Average fixed route Saturday was 16% higher<sup>1</sup>
  - o Average fixed route Sunday was 19% higher<sup>1</sup>
- Red Line shutdowns for track maintenance on 5/7, 5/8, 5/14, and 5/15 affected ridership averages for Saturday and Sunday



## Bus (MB)

Bus ridership in May 2022 was 36% higher than in May 2021

- Average weekday was 36% higher<sup>1</sup>
- Average Saturday was 25% higher<sup>1</sup>
- Average Sunday was 29% higher<sup>1</sup>



#### Red Line (HR)

Red Line ridership in May 2022 was 12% higher than in May 2021

- Average weekday was 21% higher<sup>1</sup>
- Average Saturday was 17% lower<sup>1</sup>
- Average Sunday was 11% lower<sup>1</sup>



#### Light Rail (LR)

Light Rail ridership in May 2022 was 25% higher than in May 2021

- Average weekday was 27% higher<sup>1</sup>
- Average Saturday was 22% higher<sup>1</sup>
- Average Sunday was 16% higher<sup>1</sup>



#### HealthLine (RB)


HealthLine ridership in May 2022 was 14% higher than in May 2021

- Average weekday was 14% higher<sup>1</sup>
- Average Saturday was 10% higher<sup>1</sup>
- Average Sunday was 15% higher<sup>1</sup>








Paratransit ridership in May 2022 was 27% higher than in May 2021




