Capital Improvement Fund Budget

RTA Capital – 100% Local Funds >=\$5,000 <\$250K

- Routine Capital acquisition of non-revenue vehicles and small equipment
- <u>Asset Maintenance</u> rehabilitation of current assets at passenger station or facilities.

Development Fund – grants and or local funds >=\$250K



Capital Planning Committees

Capital Program Working Group (CPWG)

- To assure an objective process when evaluating recommended capital request.
- Provide assurance that all capital needs of the authority are equally addressed
- 3. Provide a forum to discuss projects and the impact on the organization.

Capital Program Oversight Committee (CPOC)

- 1. Assure that the capital program achieve the authority's long-range goals
- 2. Maximize the return on capital investments
- 3. Maximize the use of federal and state capital grants

Ranking Criteria

State of Good Repair - 25%

• Improve the operation of existing infrastructure, or add an additional dimension/mode to existing systems

Health and Safety - 20%

• Investing in equipment, facilities and infrastructure to address identified safety and health issues.

Government Mandates - 20%

• Investing in equipment, adapting or enhancing facilities or infrastructure to satisfy government mandates.

Ridership/Transit Oriented Development -15%

 Investing in equipment, opportunities for private investment, encourage partnerships with other organization, stimulate the development of current property, for the benefit of customer satisfaction, to increase revenue and ridership.

Operating Budget Impact – 15%

• Investing in projects that will result in a direct positive impact on reducing operating expenses or improving operational efficiencies of the Authority.

Environmental Impact - 5%

 Investing in equipment, adapting facilities, or enhancing service infrastructure to support overall environmental benefits such as improved air quality.



FY 2025 Proposed Projects by Categories







- Local Funds = Sales & Use Tax, Bonds




Five Year Plan – Funding Source

Securing Additional Funding

- Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) FTA formula grants provide \$56M + GCRTA Local Match of \$14M for base funding level of \$70M per year.
- SFY2024-2025 ODOT Office of Transit administers
 \$70M of Ohio General Revenue and Flex Funding and
 \$15M of new Workforce Mobility funding.
- Competitive grants at federal, state, and local level provide majority of funding beyond the base level.

 - \$12.0M ODOT Ohio Transportation Review Advisory Council
- Total Awards of \$162.5M
