WHEREAS, GCRTA is involved with the multi-jurisdictional Northern Ohio Law Enforcement Task Force; and

WHEREAS, GCRTA derives revenue from seized and confiscated monies and/or properties of convicted drug dealers prosecuted by the Task Force; and

WHEREAS, guidelines instituted by the Office of the United States Attorney restricts the use of these funds for law enforcement purposes; and

WHEREAS, GCRTA has funds available in the Law Enforcement Fund and would like to use \$32,869.00 of these funds; and

WHEREAS the Transit Police Department intends to use these funds for unbudgeted law enforcement purposes to purchase computers for the canine vehicles, in-car camera systems and video storage for the traffic service vehicles, and parts and labor for the radio units replacement project; and

WHEREAS, no appropriation was made in the 2017 budget as this expenditure was unexpected.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, Cuyahoga County, Ohio:

Section 1. That Resolution 2016-116 adopted December 20, 2016 be hereby amended as follows:

- 1.0 PURPOSE/SCOPE: This action will amend the 2017 Appropriations Budget in order to appropriate funds in the Law Enforcement Fund.
- 2.0 DESCRIPTION/JUSTIFICATION: In 1988, RTA became involved with the multi-jurisdictional Caribbean/Gang Task Force now known as the Northern Ohio Law Enforcement Task Force. RTA's involvement was prompted by the increased gang activity found in and around the rail system. In addition to the benefits of intelligence gathering and inter-department relations, RTA derives revenue from seized and confiscated monies and/or properties of convicted drug dealers prosecuted by the Task Force.

The Office of the United States Attorney has instituted certain guidelines for the reporting and disbursement of funds including restricting the use of the funds for law enforcement purposes only. As such, the Transit Police Department would like to use these funds in the amount of \$32,869 for unbudgeted law enforcement purposes to purchase computers, camera systems, and replacement radio units.

- 3.0 PROCUREMENT BACKGROUND: Does not apply.
- 4.0 POLICY IMPACT: This action is consistent with the policy guidelines for use of funds derived from the Northern Ohio Law Enforcement Task Force, i.e. the funds must be spent for law enforcement purposes.
- 5.0 ECONOMIC IMPACT: This resolution recognizes an estimate of expenditures out of the Law Enforcement Fund in the amount of \$32,869.
- 6.0 ALTERNATIVES: Since GCRTA can only use these funds for law enforcement purposes, the only alternatives to appropriating these funds within the Law Enforcement Fund are to return the funds or to keep them on balance for use by Transit Police at another time.
- 7.0 RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board adopt this resolution as proposed.
