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Project Overview

Background

- Currently contract for basic hosting of three sites:
 - External:
 - riderta.com
 - procurement.riderta.com
 - Internal: OneRTA (intranet)
- All sites are configured, maintained, and managed by our Web Team consisting of two (2) full-time employees
- Manual management of web hosting & content creates pull for the team between content communication and necessary “nuts and bolts” of maintenance, security, and troubleshooting.

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Project Overview

Justification

- Platform as a Service (PaaS) transforms web hosting by having a 3rd party vendor perform all maintenance and general operation of the three sites.
- It enables the web team to prioritize content management, communications, and site collaboration without adding staff.
- Adding a partner to perform migration to the PaaS, training, and ongoing technical & strategic support allows GCRTA to maximize return on investment.

Scope

- Migration to new, separate 3rd party vendor environment
 - Contracting directly with PaaS provider
- Quality Assurance/User Acceptance Testing to ensure effective migration
- Minimization of downtime to production services during migration
- Staff training on environment creation, maintenance, version control, & production workflows
- Ongoing support for optimization & future development
- Demonstrated disaster recovery & cybersecurity

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Project Overview

Benefits

- Speeds up site development & content delivery
- Goes from piecemeal tools to a fully stocked, integrated toolbox
- Automates current manual elements (“nuts & bolts”)
- Improves analytics and provides more robust site performance monitoring
- Moving from Singular production to Multiple environments & instances
 - Automated workflow development, test, staging, production
- Internal resources freed for more high-impact publishing/communications/strategic work

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Procurement Overview

Evaluation Criteria:

- Proposer's ability to offer a Drupal-optimized web hosting service that includes server administration, on-demand instance management, Git version control, an embedded development workflow, and compatibility with Solr search technology.
- Ability to provide references and information related to web hosting provided and utilized by similar transit agencies and/or other public sector organizations.
- Support- training/demonstration, maintenance, and on demand support related to web hosting operation.
- Cost – Initial migration as well as ongoing support with recurring hosting fees.

Recommendation:

Staff requests that the Organizational, Services & Performance Monitoring Committee recommend to the Board of Trustees an award to Kalamuna, Inc. to provide a PaaS Web Hosting Solution for a period of three years in a negotiated amount not to exceed \$248,308.00, with two, one-year options in amounts not to exceed \$78,719.00, and \$82,654.00, respectively, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$409,681.00.
