The meeting was called to order at 5:05 p.m. There were six (6) Committee members present.

It was advised that notice of this meeting had been posted more than twenty-four hours in advance of the meeting, that the usual notification had been given to the news media and other interested persons, and that all requirements of the Ohio Revised Code and Rules and Bylaws of the Board of Trustees regarding notice of meeting had been complied with.

Approval of May 27, 2025, COC Meeting Minutes

It was moved by Ms. Wharton and seconded by Ms. Auvil for approval. All were in favor, and none opposed. The minutes were approved.

Introduction of Complaint Number C25-003

Mr. England announced that the COC received a new complaint for review, C25-003.

Executive Session Requested

5:08 p.m. – it was moved by Ms. Wharton and seconded by Mr. Taylor that the Committee enter executive session to consider the investigation of charges or complaints against a public employee, official, licensee or regulated individual, and to enable the COC to conference with GCRTA attorneys for information-gathering, fact-finding, and to receive legal advice. A roll call vote was taken; Mr. England –Yes, Ms. Auvil – Yes, Mr. Blake – Yes, Mr. Taylor – Yes, Ms. Wharton – Yes. There are six (6) ayes, motion carries.

6:27 p.m. – It was moved by Ms. Wharton and seconded by Mr. Taylor to come out of executive session. A roll call vote was taken; Mr. England –Yes, Ms. Auvil – Yes, Mr. Blake – Yes, Mr. Taylor – Yes, Ms. Wharton – Yes. There are six (6) ayes, motion carries.

<u>Discussion / Action regarding Complaint Number C25-003</u>

For Complaint Number C25-003 there were four issues identified, and the COC addressed each issue in turn.

Issue 1

Did the Transit Police Officers use their Duty weapon and Taser excessively or inappropriately when detaining the complainant?

Ms. Auvil made a motion, seconded by Ms. Wharton, that the Committee find Issue One to be "Exonerated." There were six (6) ayes and none opposed. The motion carries.

Issue 2

Did Detective Weekley use excessive force when handcuffing the complainant?

Ms. Auvil made a motion, seconded by Ms. Wharton, that the Committee find Issue Two to be "Unfounded." There were six (6) ayes and none opposed. The motion carries.

Issue 3

Did Detective Weekley cause injury to the complainant's' wrist during his detention?

Ms. Auvil made a motion, seconded by Ms. Wharton, that the Committee find Issue Three to be "Not Sustained." There were six (6) ayes and none opposed. The motion carries.

Issue 4

Was the detention of the complainant racially motivated?

Ms. Gordon made a motion, seconded by Ms. Wharton, that the Committee find Issue Four to be "Unfounded." There were six (6) ayes and none opposed. The motion carries.

New Business

Ms. Wharton wanted to go on record stating that the report that the Committee received in their executive session was very well done and thorough and that the Committee appreciates Transit Police's dedication to the Committee's process and investigation.

Ms. Bailey reminded the Committee that they needed to give her their availability for the COC social gathering that they asked for. Once everyone confirmed their schedule the social will be scheduled and notice will be sent out.

Upon receipt of a completed complaint form, the complaint will be assigned for investigation. Completed investigations will be classified as follows:

- Sustained- There is sufficient evidence to establish that the alleged act occurred and constituted misconduct.
- · Sustained in Part- There is sufficient evidence to establish that one or more, but not all, alleged acts occurred.
- Sustained for Violation Not Based on the Original Complaint- There is sufficient evidence to establish that an act of misconduct occurred that was not part of the violations alleged in the Complaint.
- · Unfounded- The alleged acts did not occur, did not involve Department personnel, or are frivolous.
- · Exonerated- The alleged acts occurred, but were justified, lawful, and/or proper.
- · Not-sustained- The facts and circumstances fail to establish if the conduct occurred.
- Administratively Dismissed-The complaint is not GCRTA related, does not involve a Transit Police employee, or
 is related to a service delay that is determined to be unavoidable.
