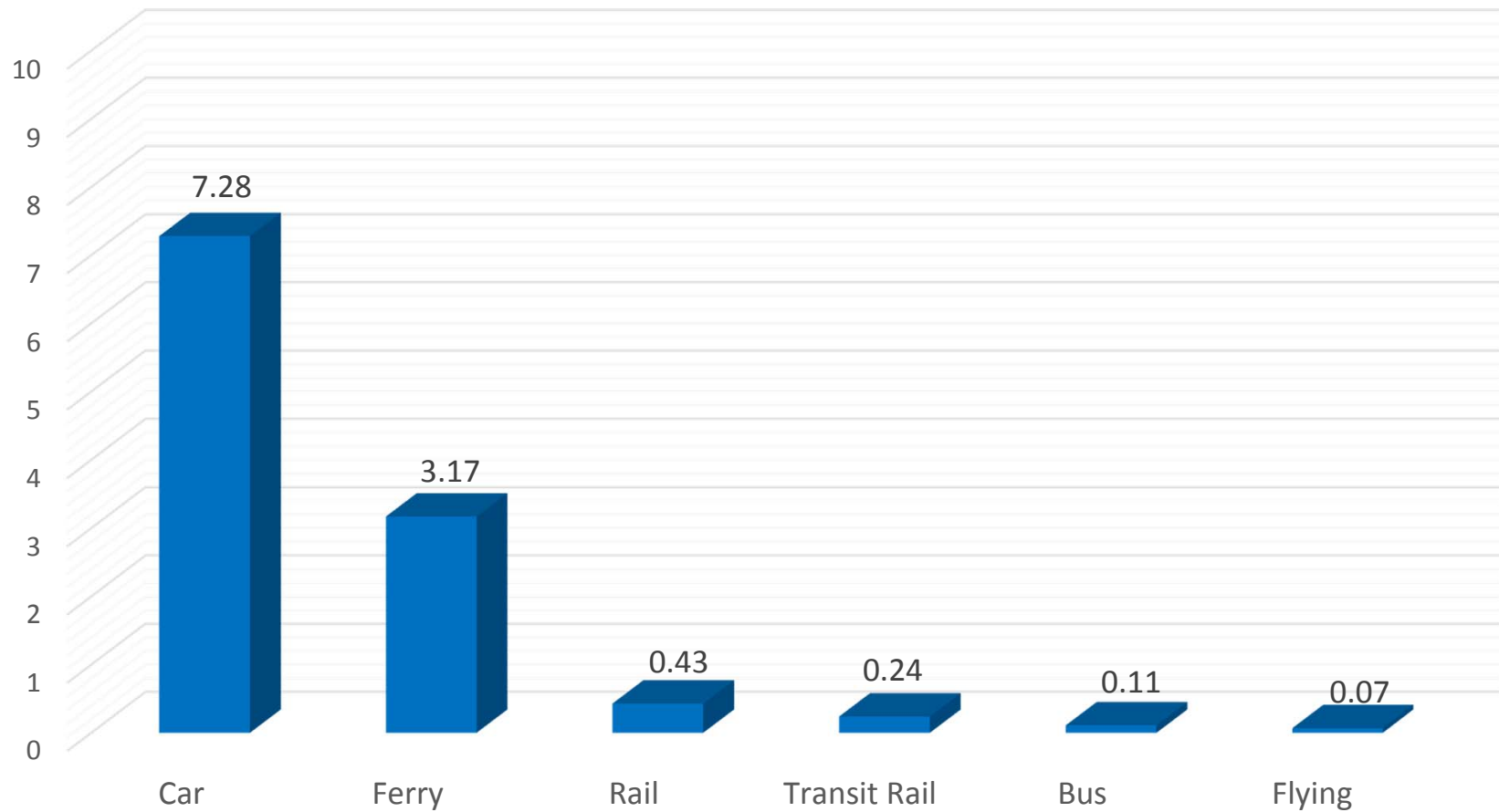

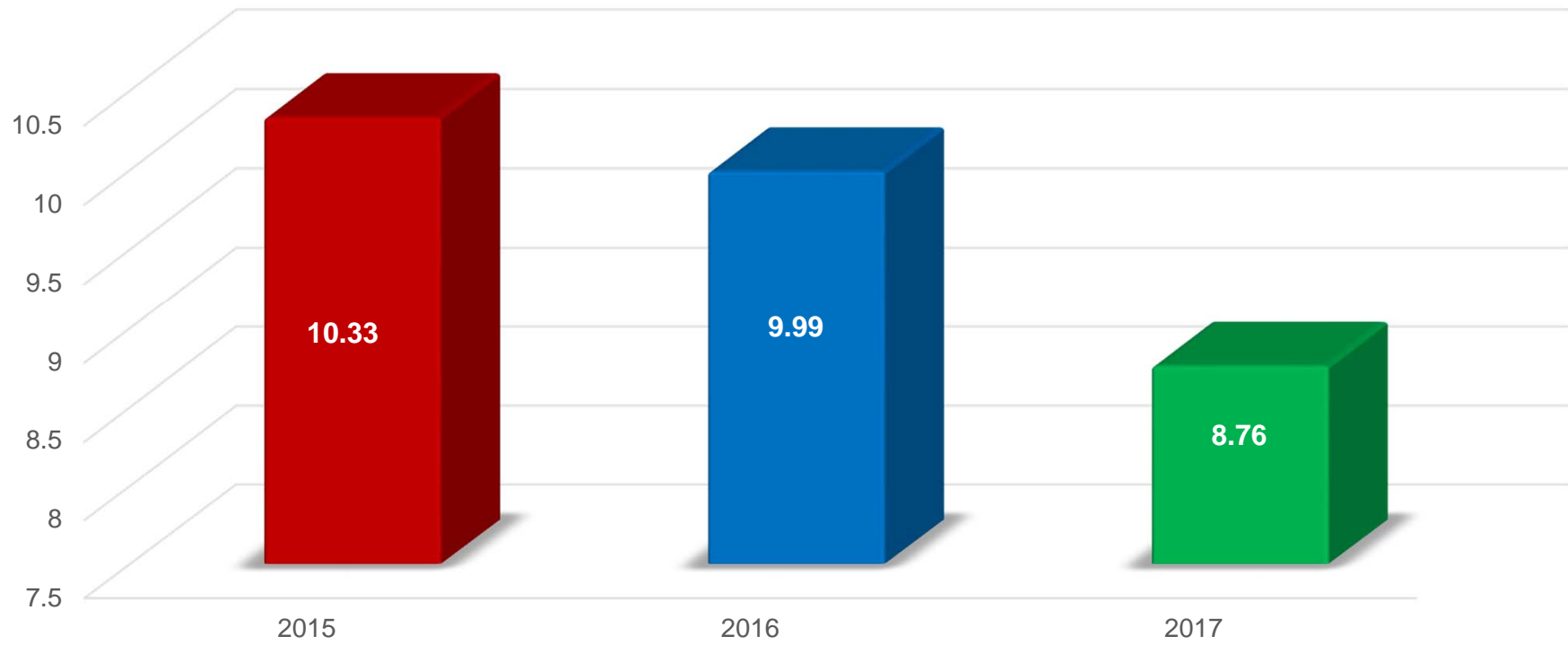

## GCRTA On-The-Job Injury Rate 2015 – 2017 per 200,000 hours worked All data through July

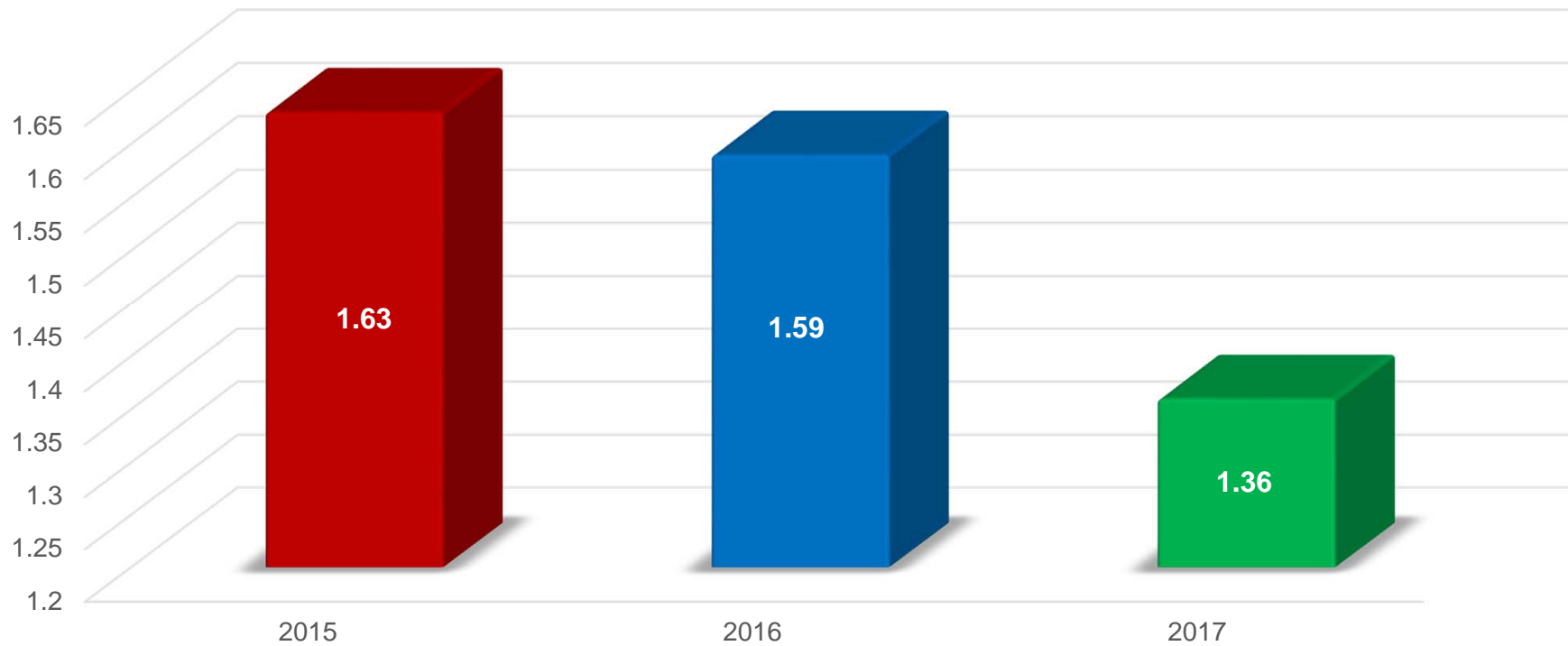

All data through July



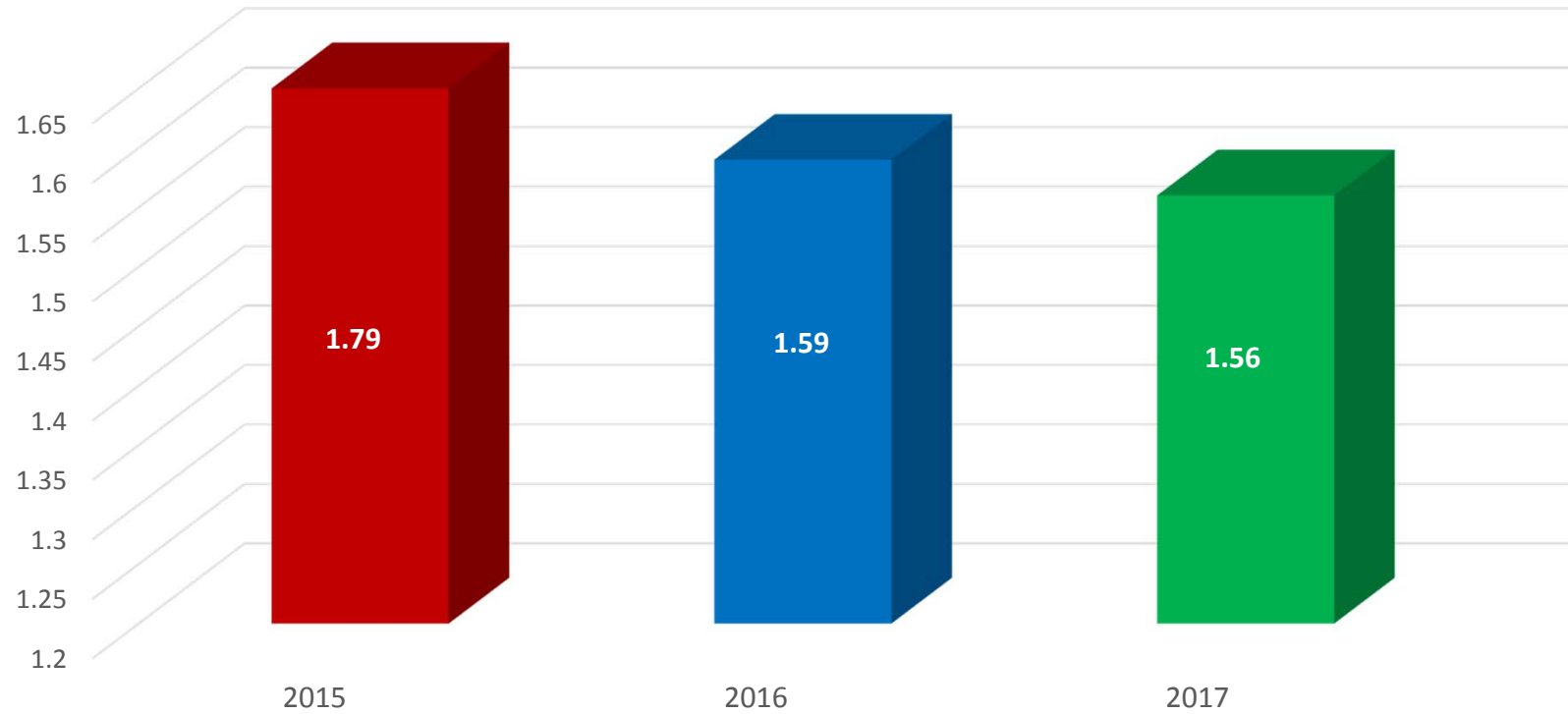
17% decrease

All Data through July



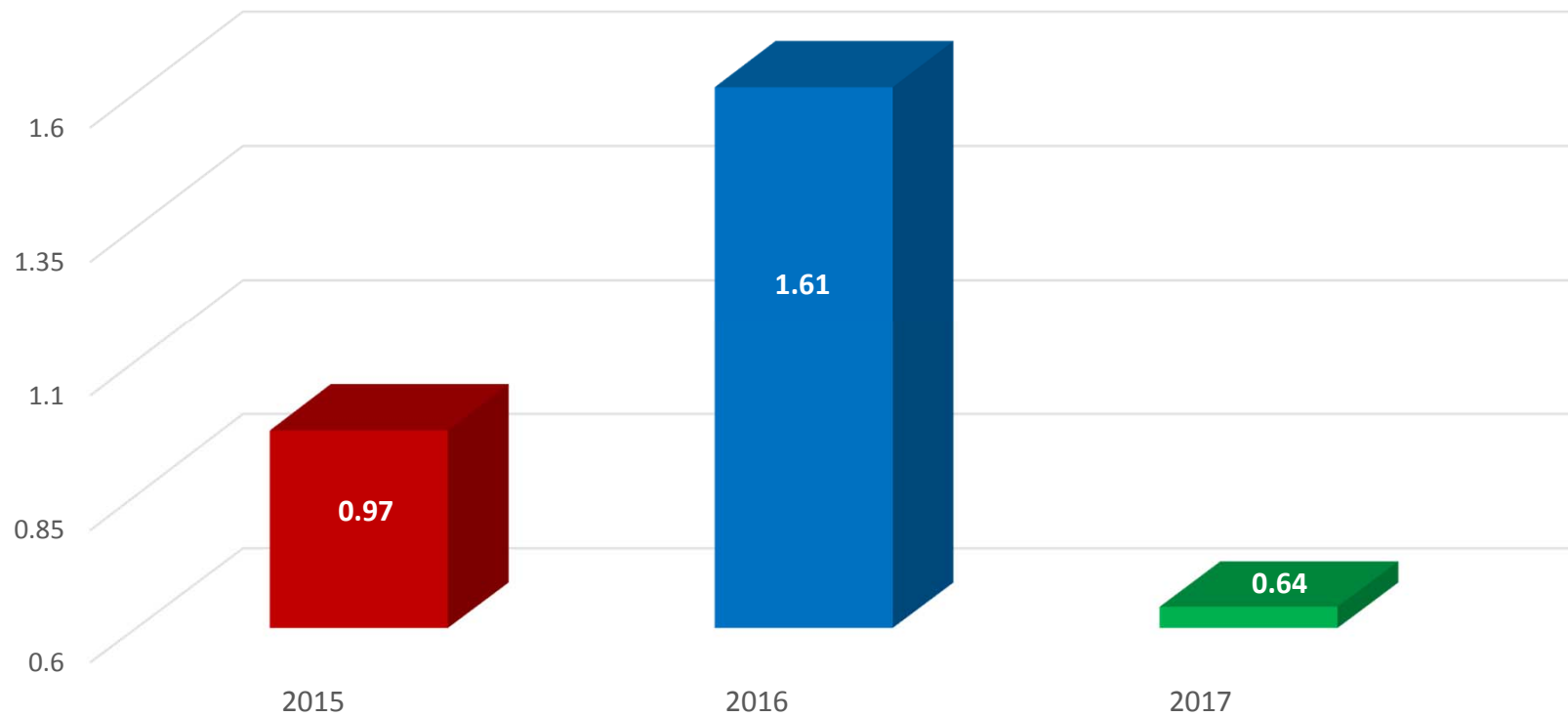
13% decrease

2015 - 2017 per 100,000 Miles Driven

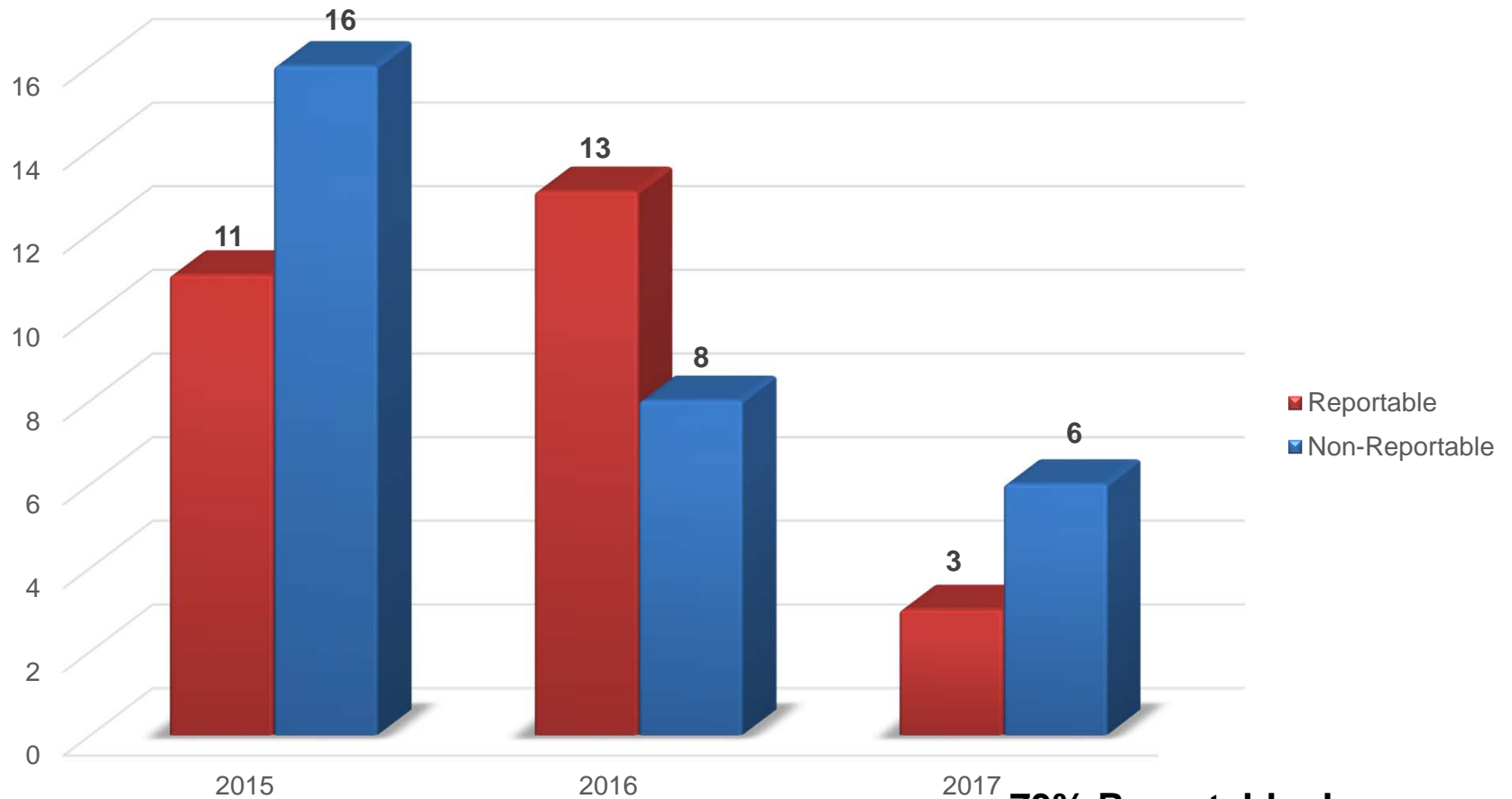

Approximately 8 million passengers per year

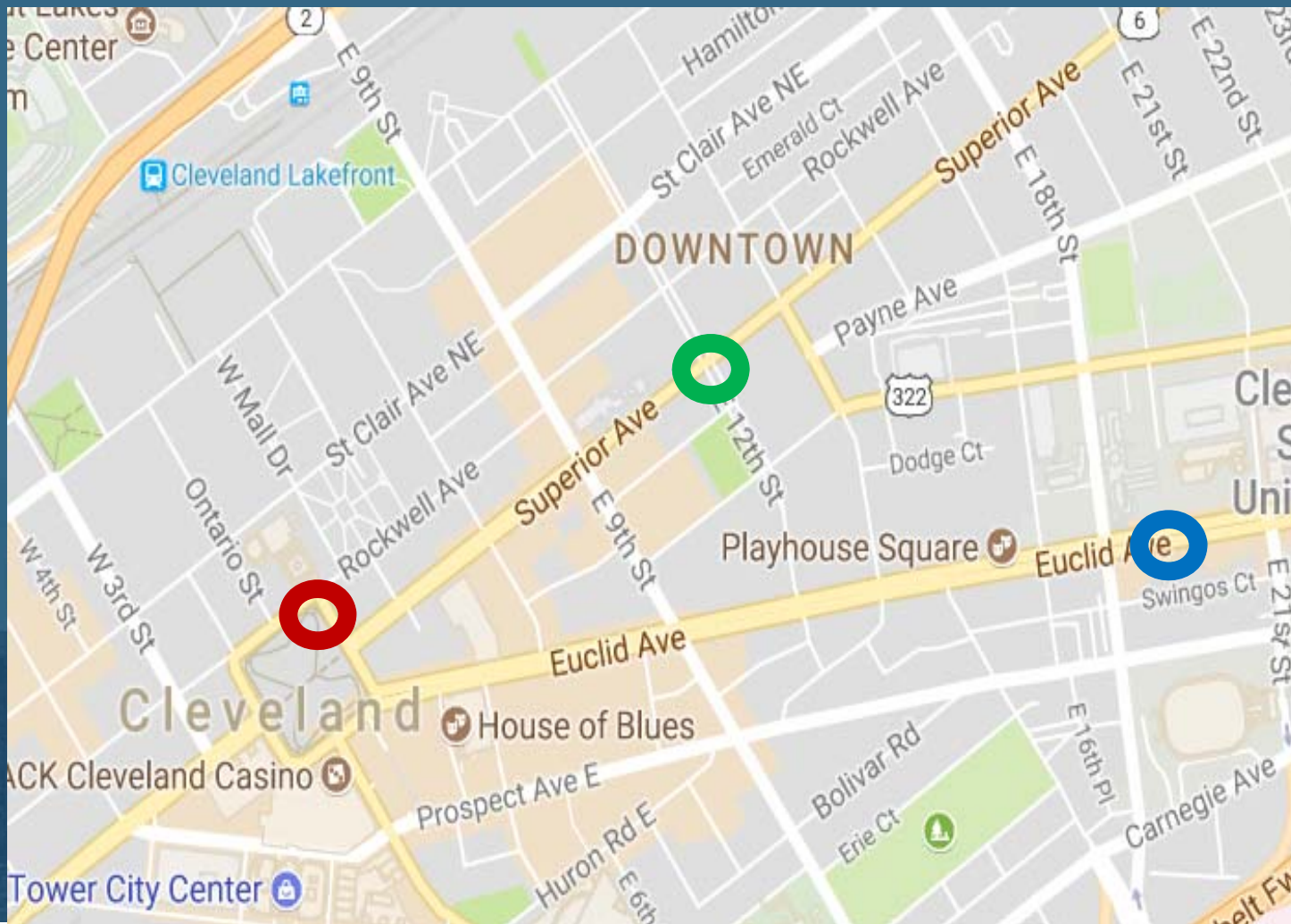
# 2016 Annual Program Status Report

- FTA requires Annual Report and Submittal to Board
- Highlights the 2016 (ODOT) Rail Transit State Safety Oversight program
- GCRTA Rail System Safety Program is being managed properly and all deadlines continue to be met on time
- Ohio is the first state to receive FTA Rail State Safety Oversight Certification – protects funding

# Enhanced Transit Safety Retrofit Package (E-TRP)

- Technology project to enhance bus safety at designated crosswalks and bus stops
- Meant to save lives
- 24 Buses currently being outfitted
- Testing begins week of December 18, 2017
