Regulations and Requirements

Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990

- Protects the rights of persons with disabilities to use available public transportation.
- Persons who are functionally unable to use fixed-route service must be provided complementary paratransit service.
 - Complementary service is defined as equivalent day of the week, time, and geographic area.
- GCRTA is required to deliver every paratransit eligible trip without denials.

Paratransit Priorities

- Leverage Scheduling Technology
- Improve the Customer Service Experience
- Modernize Communication Technology
- Increase on-time performance (OTP)
- Reduce on-board travel times (OBT)



Current Status of Paratransit

- Currently in Option Year 1 (Year 4) of current contract
- Current challenges
 - Recovery of ridership post COVID-19
 - Current labor market constraints
 - Inflationary factors



People Strategy & Benefits

- Successful proposers were required to:
 - Demonstrate ability to attract and retain talent
 - Increase beginning wages with annual wage increases
 - Demonstrate a competitive benefits package
- Benefits to GCRTA
 - Increased pool of potential candidates
 - Ability to attract employees with higher customer service-related skills
 - Reduce the risk of capacity constraints
 - Higher on-time performance and reduced on-board time



Scope of Services

- Balances people strategy with business performance metrics
- Constant audio and video recording
- Aligning liquidated damages to customer expectations
- Increases standard for customer experience expectations



Scope of Services, continued

- Increase in minimum accessibility percentages (50% to 80%)
- Increases liability requirements to 3rd party recommendations
- Standardizing billing methods for all vendors
- Standardizing market fuel escalator/de-escalator



- Request for Proposal (RFP) issued on August 15, 2022
- Accessed on the GCRTA website by 50 interested parties
- 7 firms proposed

Evaluation Criteria

Objectively measured results achieved on similar contracts —
 Successful proposals should include quantitative results (along with clear definitions of terms) that have been achieved by the proposer, and by its proposed subcontractors, on similar contracts. At a minimum, these measures must be included: missed runs as a percentage of scheduled runs, late pull outs as a percentage of scheduled runs, late passenger pick-ups as a percentage of all pick-ups, late passenger drop-offs as a percentage of all drop-offs.



Evaluation Criteria, continued

- Qualifications and relevant experience Experience working for public transit agencies in similar markets. Qualifications and resumes of project staff, project manager, and key personnel; experience of the contractor and its employees, agents, and subcontractors performing work of similar nature; strength and stability of the proposing firm.
- **Cost** Reasonableness of the rates and overall total price; competitiveness of the price proposal with other offers received; adequacy of data in support of the rates and prices.



Evaluation Criteria, continued

- People strategy and scalability The ability to attract and retain staffing levels, including subcontractors to meet the customer demand of GCRTA. Ability to adjust staffing levels to scale up should another provider scale down.
- Capital resources and infrastructure Demonstrates an appropriate age of vehicles, accessibility of vehicles (including percentage of vehicles to accommodate wheelchairs/ scooters), fleet size, maintenance program, and camera system(s).

• An amount not to exceed \$11,106,075.91 for a period of three years, and in amounts not to exceed \$3,912,322.56 and \$4,016,054.09 for each option year, respectively, for a total five-year contract amount not to exceed \$19,034,452.56.

Senior Transportation Connection, located in Cleveland, Ohio

• An amount not to exceed \$5,400,370.89 for a period of three years, and in amounts not to exceed \$1,916,788.07 and \$1,978,398.27 for each option year, respectively, for a total five-year contract amount not to exceed \$9,295,557.23.

Staff requests that the Organizational, Services and Performance Monitoring Committee recommend to the Board of Trustees the awards for Contracted Paratransit Services to Future Age Inc. dba Provide A Ride in a total contract amount NTE \$29,762,307.86, to GC Logistics of Mississippi, LLC in a total contract amount NTE \$19,034,452.56, and to Senior Transportation Connection in a total contract amount NTE \$9,295,557.23, resulting in a five-year total amount NTE \$58,092,317.65. This compares to a five-year total amount NTE \$54,244,140.16 awarded under the 2019 contract.
