# Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority Ridership Report – March 2023

### **Summary**

- Ridership continued to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic and resulting shutdowns
- System ridership in March 2023 was 1.8 million, representing 15% more riders than in March 2022
  - Average fixed route weekday was 15% higher<sup>1</sup>
  - Average fixed route Saturday was 18% higher<sup>1</sup>
  - o Average fixed route Sunday was 14% higher<sup>1</sup>

# <u>Bus (MB)</u>

Bus ridership in March 2023 was 18% higher than in March 2022

- Average weekday was 19% higher<sup>1</sup>
- Average Saturday was 22% higher<sup>1</sup>
- Average Sunday was 20% higher<sup>1</sup>

## Red Line (HR)

Red Line ridership in March 2023 was 1% higher than in March 2022

- Average weekday was 1% higher<sup>1</sup>
- Average Saturday was 6% higher<sup>1</sup>
- Average Sunday was 1% lower<sup>1</sup>

# Light Rail (LR)

Light Rail ridership in March 2023 was 13% higher than in March 2022

- Average weekday was 17% higher<sup>1</sup>
- Average Saturday was 24% higher<sup>1</sup>
- Average Sunday was 24% higher<sup>1</sup>



# HealthLine (RB)

HealthLine ridership in March 2023 was 11% higher than in March 2022

- Average weekday was 12% higher<sup>1</sup>
- Average Saturday was 12% higher<sup>1</sup>
- Average Sunday was 11% higher<sup>1</sup>


# <u>Paratransit (DR)</u>

Paratransit ridership in March 2023 was 16% higher than in March 2022











### Avg. Ridership by Day Type (no Paratransit)
