











# Rail System Safety Program Plan (RSSPP)

Definition: A guidance document developed for Rail, describing its policies, objectives, responsibilities, and procedures to safely manage the system. Under MAP-21 requirements, (49 CFR Part 673), the RSSPP serves as the interim Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan until July 19, 2020.





## Rail System Safety Program Plan (RSSPP)

- First developed by GCRTA in 2001.
- Primary goal is to plan, design, construct, test, and operate a rail system that attains an optimum level of safety.
- 21 sections audited over 3 years. Approved by ODOT on 2/28/19.
- Required to be approved by Board of Trustees annually.
- Triennial Audit of the RSSPP was completed September 2018.





- A Bus System Safety Program Plan (BSSPP) also exists for GCRTA.
- The GCRTA Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan will combine the two SSPPs in 2020 and include SMS (Safety Management System) as a formal, top-down organization-wide approach to managing risk and our mitigation strategies.

**PROCUREMENT**

## Safety Performance

- Zero Grade Crossing Incidents in 2018 and year-to-date.
- The Rail District achieved an Occupational Injury Rate 7% better than the TEAM goal 2018.
- The Power & Way unit and the Rail Operators have reduced injury experience by 50% year-todate.
