

# SUMMARY OF AWARD Ruggedized Tablets for Non-Revenue Vehicles

#### PROJECT OVERVIEW:

The Transit Police Department of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority ('Authority") operates an Computer Aided Dispatch and Automated Vehicle Locator (CAD/AVL) software. The CAD/AVL, along with the Authority's radio system, allows the Transit Police dispatchers to communicate and track vehicles. Officers utilize the CAD/AVL on their computers to verify real-time data with the dispatchers to help improve situational awareness and improve speed and accuracy of field reporting.

The Authority's support departments, including Service Quality, Electronic Repair and Mobile Equipment Mechanics, play vital roles in keeping the equipment and services running at safe and optimal levels. These departments utilize the CAD/AVL system, TransitMaster, to locate vehicles in service, view real-time data/communications, and to respond to urgent needs of the vehicles and passengers. For the CAD/AVL system to function properly, the hardware and software must be maintained and operational. If one hardware/software component fails, it affects the system and, in many cases, causes the other areas of the system to fail.

The current devices are several years old and many of them are not rated for rugged/mobile usage, causing further system failures and repetitive maintenance. The Authority has identified a viable ruggedized solution to meet the needs of each of these departments. Replacing these devices will ensure the safety of passengers, employees and vehicles, as well as, maintain the highest level of services possible.

#### PROCUREMENT OVERVIEW:

The Invitation for Bid ("IFB") for the Ruggedized Tablets for Non-Revenue was issued on September 10, 2023. The necessary legal notice was published in the <u>Plain Dealer</u> and <u>Call & Post</u> newspapers. The IFB was also published on the RTA web site.

The IFB was accessed and/or downloaded from the web site by forty-one (41) interested parties. Six (6) bids were received and opened on October 12, 2023. Of those six (6) bids, there were two (2) responsive bids. They are as follows:

The Basis of Award is the lowest responsive bid from a responsible bidder for the Total Base Bid price. Baycom, Inc. was determined to be a responsive and responsible bidder. The Total Base Bid is 24.73% below the project estimate of \$349,995.00.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

The Office of Business Development has set a 0% DBE participation goal for this project. A resolution will request authorization to issue a contract to Baycom, Inc. to provide the Ruggedized Tablets for Non-Revenue Vehicles in a total amount of \$263,444.40.

# SUMMARY OF PROPOSED AWARD CAD/AVL Maintenance & Support

#### PROJECT OVERVIEW:

The Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority has an ongoing need for annual maintenance and support for its Computer Aided Dispatch and Automated Vehicle Locator (CAD/AVL) software, branded as "OnRoute" (Formerly known as TransitMaster). OnRoute is a product of Trapeze Software Group, Inc. dba Vontas ('Vontas"). The CAD/AVL system along with GCRTA's radio system allows the Authority to track vehicles, monitor on-time performance and talk/text with vehicle operators.

The CAD/AVL system, including the hardware and software it is comprised of, must be properly maintained and supported in order to function effectively. At the December 5, 2023 Operational Planning & Infrastructure Committee meeting, staff will present the proposed FY 2024 Budget. A second public hearing will be held after the budget presentation.

The proposed FY 2024 Budget includes total revenues of \$335.4 million. The two largest sources of revenue are Sales & Use Tax and Passenger Fares estimated at \$268.3 million and \$27.1 million, respectively.

Operating expenditures are budgeted at \$293.6 million, which includes funding for 26 new positions and wage increases, which are largely contractual through the FOP and ATU. Transfers to other funds total \$40.2 million, which includes a 10% transfer for the Capital Improvement Program. With total expenditures of \$333.8 million against total revenues of \$335.4 million, and a beginning balance of \$22.0 million, the projected ending balance is budgeted at \$23.6 million, or a 1.0-month reserve.

#### 212.01 DEFINITIONS.

As used in these <u>Policies and ProceduresCodified Rules and Regulations of the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority</u>, unless otherwise expressly provided or the context otherwise requires:

- (a) "And" may be read "or," and "or" may be read "and," if the sense requires it.
- (b) "Authority" means the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, established pursuant to Ohio-R.C. 306.32.
- (c) "Board" means the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, appointed as provided in Ohio-R.C. 306.33.
- (d) "County" means Cuyahoga County, Ohio.
- (e) "Land" and "real estate" include rights and easements of an incorporeal nature.

- (f) "Law" means any and all laws, including constitutions, statutes, ordinances, resolutions, rules, regulations, motions and orders, of the United States, any state, any political subdivision of a state, any municipal corporation or any other legal entity.
  - (g) "May" is permissive.
  - (h) "Month" means a calendar month.
- (i) "Motion" means a legislative enactment of the Board of Trustees that is recorded in the minutes of the Board but which is not separately published.
- (j) "Owner," when applied to property, includes a part owner, joint owner or tenant in common of the whole or any part of such property.
- (k) "Person" means the State, a municipal corporation, a political subdivision, a public or private corporation, an individual, a partnership, a firm, an association, a business trust, an estate, a trust or any other entity.
- "Premises," when used as applicable to property, extends to and includes land and buildings.
- (m) "Property" includes real and personal property and any mixed and lesser estates or interests therein. "Personal property" includes every kind of property except real property; "real property" includes land, tenements and hereditaments.
- (n) "Public place" means any place to or upon which the public resorts or travels, whether such place is owned or controlled by a municipality, the State or the United States, or any agency of the State or the United States, or is a place to or upon which the public resorts or travels by custom or by invitation, express or implied.
- (o) "Reasonable time" means such time only as may be necessary for the prompt performance of an act or the giving of required notice.
  - (p) "Residence" means an abode in which a person permanently resides.
- (q) "Resolution" means a legislative enactment of the Board of Trustees that is separately published and recorded.
  - (r) "Shall" is mandatory.
- (s) "Sidewalk" means that portion of a street between the curb lines or lateral lines and the right-of-way lines, which is intended for the use of pedestrians.
  - (t) "State" means the State of Ohio.
- (u) "Street," "highway" and "alley" mean the entire width subject to an easement for public right of way, or owned in fee by a municipality, county or the State, of every way or place, of whatever nature, whenever any part thereof is open to the use of the public as a matter of right for purposes of public travel. The word "alley" means any such way or place providing a secondary means of ingress and egress from a property.

- (v) "Transit facility" means:
- (1) A street railway, motor bus, tramline, subway, monorail, rapid transit, aeroplane airplane, helicopter, ferry or other ground or water transportation system having as its primary purpose the regularly scheduled mass movement of passengers between locations within the territorial boundaries of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, including all rights of way, power lines, rolling stock, equipment, machinery, terminals, buildings, administration and maintenance and repair facilities, and supporting parking facilities, and franchise rights attendant thereto, but excluding therefrom trucks and facilities designed for use in the movement of property by truck;
- (2) Docks, wharves, warehouses, piers and other port, terminal or transportation facilities and marinas;
- (3) Facilities used, available for use or designed for use to aid in the safe taking off or landing of aircraft, for the safety, storage and maintenance of aircraft, for the comfort and accommodation of users of air transportation, including persons, property and mail, or for the safe and efficient operation and maintenance of an airport, and buildings and facilities as are reasonably necessary for the comfort and accommodation of the users of transit facilities; or
  - (4) Any combination of the foregoing.
- (w) "Written" and "in writing" include any representation of words, letters or figures, whether by printing or otherwise.

### 212.02 RULES OF CONSTRUCTION.

- (a) Common and Technical Use. Words and phrases shall be read in context and construed according to the rules of grammar and common usage. Words and phrases that have acquired a technical or particular meaning, whether by legislative definition or otherwise, shall be construed accordingly.

- (2) If a number of months is to be computed by counting the months from a particular day, the period ends on the same numerical day in the concluding month as the day of the month from which the computation is begun, unless there are not that many days in the concluding month, in which case the period ends on the last day of that month.
- (3) When an act is to take effect or become operative from and after a day named, no part of that day shall be included.
- (d) Liberal Construction. All general provisions, terms, phrases and expressions contained in these <u>Codified Rules and Regulations</u> <u>Policies and Procedures of the Board of Trustees</u> of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority shall be liberally construed in order that the true intent and meaning of the Board of Trustees may be fully carried out.
- (e) Minimum Requirements. In the interpretation and application of these Codified Rules and Regulations Policies and Procedures, they shall be held to be the minimum requirements adopted for the promotion of the public health, safety, comfort, convenience and general welfare.

# 212.03 REVIVOR; EFFECT OF RE-ENACTMENT, AMENDMENT OR REPEAL.

- (a) The repeal of a repealing provision of these <u>Codified Rules and Regulations Policies and Procedures of the Board of Trustees</u> of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority does not revive the provision originally repealed or impair the effect of any saving clause therein.
- (b) The re-enactment, amendment or repeal of a provision of these <u>Codified</u>
  <u>Rules and Regulations</u>Policies and <u>Procedures</u> does not, except as provided in subsection (c) hereof:
- Affect the prior operation of the provision or any prior action taken thereunder;
- (2) Affect any validation, cure, right, privilege, obligation or liability previously acquired, accrued, accorded or incurred thereunder;
- (3) Affect any violation thereof or penalty, forfeiture or punishment incurred in respect thereto, prior to the amendment or repeal;
- (4) Affect any investigation, proceeding or remedy in respect of any such privilege, obligation, liability, penalty, forfeiture or punishment; and the investigation, proceeding or remedy may be instituted, continued or enforced, and the penalty, forfeiture or punishment imposed, as if the provision had not been repealed or amended.

(c) If the penalty, forfeiture or punishment for any offense is reduced by a re-enactment or amendment of a provision of these <u>Codified Rules and Regulations Policies and Procedures</u>, the penalty, forfeiture or punishment, if not already imposed, shall be imposed according to the provision as amended.

## 212.04 CONSTRUCTION OF SECTION REFERENCES.

- (a) A reference to any portion of a provision of these Policies and Procedures of the Board of Trustees Codified Rules and Regulations of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority applies to all re-enactments or amendments thereof.
- (b) References in these Policies and Procedures Codified Rules and Regulations to action taken or authorized under designated sections of these Policies and Procedures Codified Rules and Regulations include, in every case, action taken or authorized under the applicable legislative provision which is superseded by these Policies and Procedures Codified Rules and Regulations.

## 212.05 CONFLICT OF LAWS.

- (a) In the event of a conflict or inconsistency between any of the provisions of any resolution or motion enacted by the Board of Trustees and a provision of the Bylaws of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, the provision of the Bylaws shall control.
- (b) In the event of a conflict or inconsistency between any of the provisions of these Policies and Procedures of the Board of Trustees Codified Rules and Regulations of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority and another provision of these Codified Rules and Regulations Policies and Procedures, including provisions of codes, rules, regulations, agreements, policies, procedures or other documents adopted by reference in these Codified Rules and Regulations Policies and Procedures, or otherwise adopted by the Board of Trustees but not codified in full in these Codified Rules and Regulations Policies and Procedures, that provision which is later in date shall control, but if neither provision is later in date than the other, then that provision which establishes the higher or stricter standard, or imposes the greater restriction or regulation, shall control.
- (c) In the event of a conflict or inconsistency between any of the provisions of these <u>Codified Rules and Regulations</u> Policies and Procedures, including provisions of codes, rules, regulations, agreements, policies, procedures or other documents adopted by reference in these <u>Codified Rules and Regulations</u> Policies and Procedures, or otherwise adopted by the Board of Trustees but not codified in full in these <u>Codified Rules and Regulations</u> Policies and Procedures, and a provision of <u>State state</u> or <u>Federal federal</u> law, the provision of <u>State state</u> or <u>Federal federal</u> law shall control, except in those cases where the Board of Trustees is expressly authorized by <u>State state</u> or <u>Federal federal</u> law to enact legislation that is not consistent with <u>State state</u> and/or <u>Federal federal</u> law.

### 212.06 SEVERABILITY.

- (a) Each section and each part of each section of these Codified Rules and Regulations Policies and Procedures of the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority is hereby declared to be an independent section or part of a section and, notwithstanding any other evidence of legislative intent, it is hereby declared to be the controlling legislative intent that if any such section or part of a section, or any provision thereof, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held to be invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining sections or parts of sections and the application of such provision to any other person or circumstance, other than those as to which it is held invalid or unconstitutional, shall not be affected thereby, and it is hereby declared to be the legislative intent that these Codified Rules and Regulations Policies and Procedures would have been adopted independently of such section or part of a section so held to be invalid.
- (b) The provisions of this section shall apply to the amendment of any section of these Codified Rules and Regulations Policies and Procedures, whether or not the wording of this section is set forth in the amendatory resolution or motion.

#### 212.07 REPEAL.

- (a) All motions and resolutions and parts of motions and resolutions of the Board of Trustees, and all rules, regulations and orders promulgated under authority of such motions and resolutions, or under authority of State-state or Federal federal law, that are in conflict with or in any manner inconsistent with any of the provisions of these Codified Rules and Regulations Policies and Procedures of the Board of Trustees of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority, are hereby repealed.
- (b) The repeal of any motion, resolution, rule, regulation or order shall not affect any punishment or penalty incurred before the repeal takes effect, or any suit, prosecution or proceeding pending at the time of the repeal, for an offense committed or cause of action arising under the motion, resolution, rule, regulation or order repealed.

# 465.01 FEDERAL GRANT APPLICATIONS.

- (a) Federal Grants.
  - (1) The CEO, General Manager/Secretary Treasurer, Chief Executive Officer may execute and file applications for Federal federal assistance on behalf of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit - Authority.
  - (2) The CEO, General Manager/Secretary Treasurer, Chief Executive Officer may execute and file with its applications, certifications and

assurances and other documents the awarding agency may require for a Federal assistance grant or cooperating agreement. (Res. 2007-165. Passed 11-20-07.)

(b) The CEO, General Manager/Secretary Treasurer, Chief Executive Officer—may submit grant applications to the State of Ohio Department of Transportation, to provide for the State's share of the non-Federal federal funds necessary for Federal federal grant applications executed and filed as provided for in subsection (a)(1) hereof, and State state funding for other eligible transit projects.

- (b) The CEO, General Manager/Secretary Treasurer, Chief Executive Officer may execute grant contracts with the State of Ohio on behalf of the Authority. (Res. 2016-69. Passed 8-16-16.)

## 465.04 DOCUMENTS, REPORTS AND INFORMATION.

- (a) <u>Information Required by the State of Ohio</u>. The <u>CEO</u>, General Manager/Secretary Treasurer, <u>Chief Executive Officer</u> may furnish such additional information, assurances or other documentation, execute any and all documents or assurances and make such reports as is necessary and required by the State of Ohio for <u>State state</u> grant funds on behalf of the Authority. (Res. 1992-17. Passed 1-21-92.)
  - (b) <u>Information Required by the United States Government</u>.
    - (1) The CEO, General Manager/Secretary Treasurer, Chief Executive Officer may execute and file assurances or other documents, and furnish such additional information as the awarding Federal federal

- agencies may require in connection with Federal grant applications on behalf of the Authority.
- (2) The CEO, General Manager/Secretary Treasurer, Chief Executive Officer may set forth and execute affirmative minority business policies in connection with the procurement needs for projects funded by Federal federal grants.

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465.05 ACCEPTANCE AND EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS.

- (a) The CEO, General Manager/Secretary Treasurer, Chief Executive Officer may accept Federal funds from awarding Federal federal agencies on behalf of the Authority and expend such funds in accordance with applicable law, regulations and grant agreements. (Res. 2007-165. Passed 11-20-07.)
- (b) The CEO, General Manager/Secretary Treasurer, Chief Executive Officer may accept and receive funds from the State of Ohio and expend the same pursuant to the terms and conditions of corresponding grant contracts with the State of Ohio. (Res. 1992-17. Passed 1-21-92.)
- (c) The CEO, General Manager/Secretary Treasurer, Chief Executive Officer may apply to the Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency ("NOACA") and the Federal Transit Administration ("FTA") for funds allocated by NOACA, execute any necessary agreements with NOACA and FTA, accept Federal federal funds from the FTA, received through agreements with NOACA, and expend such funds in accordance with applicable law, regulations and grant agreements. # 465.06 FUNDS ALLOCATED BY THE NORTHEAST OHIO AREAWIDE COORDINATING AGENCY ("NOACA")

- (a) That the General Manager, Chief Executive Officer is hereby authorized to file applications, as required, and to execute contracts, as required, on behalf of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority with the Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency ("NOACA") for financial assistance and capital project programs (including transfer of highway funds) under all NOACA programs.
- (b) That the General Manager, Chief Executive Officer is authorized to execute and file such applications, any assurances or any other documentation required by NOACA under the financial assistance and capital project programs.

Regional Transit Authority is willing to provide the local match amount for any funding awarded to it by NOACA and (3) the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority represents in writing to NOACA that it is willing to provide the local match amount for any funding awarded to it by NOACA.

(e) That the General Manager, Chief Executive Officer is authorized to accept the funds resulting from the NOACA financial assistance and capital programs.

## 465.01465.07 PRIVATE GRANTS.

The CEO, General Manager/Secretary Treasurer, Chief Executive Officer is hereby authorized to borrow or accept grants from private sources in accordance with State law.

## 465.02465.08 AUTHORITY OF ACTING GENERAL MANAGER/ SECRETARY TREASURER. CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER.

In the absence of the CEO, General Manager/Secretary Treasurer, Chief Executive Officer, the Acting CEO, General Manager/Secretary Treasurer, Chief Executive Officer of the Authority is hereby authorized to perform any and all of the functions described in this chapter.
