o Justification:

- The Authority provides HMO medical benefits to approximately 400 employees which accounts for approximately 20% of the workforce enrolled in health benefits
- Benefits for ATU and FOP provided in accordance with collective bargaining agreements and are also provided to non-bargaining employees

- Scope of Services
- GCRTA solicited coverage for:
 - Heath Maintenance Organization (HMO)
 - Prescription Drugs
 - One year contract with two, one-year options to align with other medical contracts

- Scope of Services (continued)
- o The following options were reviewed:
 - Self-insured versus Fully-insured
 - Wellness and Disease Management programs
 - Network Accessibility

- o RFP issued on June 1, 2015
- RFP downloaded by 16 interested parties
- 5 vendors responded

- Recommended Vendor:
 - o University Hospitals, Cleveland, Ohio
 - oDBE Goal was set at 12%
 - Washington Enterprises, Inc.

- Recommended Vendor continued:
 - University Hospitals strengths include:
 - Over 30 Major Outpatient Centers
 - o 1,600 Employed Physicians
 - Strong Health Management Program including Disease & Case Management and Health Education & Wellness

- Recommended Vendor continued:
 - o Estimate flat cost per employee member
 - Self-insured vs fully-insured for first time under HMO contract
 - Claims ran approximately \$4,000,000 or 10% below 2013 premium rate

o Recommendation:

o Staff requests that the Finance Committee recommend to the Board of Trustees an award to University Hospitals to provide HMO and Rx Benefits for one year with two, one-year options in an amount of \$4,665,996 for the first year based on estimated enrollment for 2016.
