Ms. Moss called the meeting to order at 10:13 a.m. The secretary called the roll and reported that five (5) committee members were present.

Internal Audit Quarterly Report

Tony Garofoli, executive director of Internal Audit, made the presentation. This is the review of the first quarter 2018 audit work. The May report was postponed until today. On pages 3-5 is the Internal Audit plan, approved by the Board in March. He is 60 days behind in attaining the plan due to other issues. His staff will have a retreat and access the risk of RTA and reprioritize the plan, which he will present at an upcoming meeting.

Pages 6-8 include completed projects. They include Employee Travel Expense and Reimbursement. They always do a continuous audit of the Customer Fare Collections, but they have nothing to report on that item. Collections are going according to plan per the internal control environment. Thirty (30) paratransit vehicles were placed into service the first quarter. Compliance reviews were completed in accordance with federal requirements. They completed an audit of the Safety Department which is required by the State Safety Oversight Program. They received good marks from the SSOP.

Pages 9-15 include fifteen projects that are in progress, which were suspended. They will be reviewed as part of their reprioritization. Pages 16-20 are ten projects, which are special request or emerging issues. They include the Paratransit Investigation, Customer Service Center Investigation and the Compound Drug Investigation. All three matters were turned over to the crime insurance carrier. They completed the reviews and met all the criteria of the contracts. They are awaiting a response from the insurance company.

Later this month, the State Auditors will present with DGM of Finance and Administration, Rajan Gautam, the 2017 Single Audit, in Executive Session. They've been working with them since Oct.-Nov. of last year with their interim review and this year with some line items on the balance sheet that they need support on. Later this year, the FTA will conduct a Triennial Review of the Rail Safety & Security Program. Pages 22-23 include outstanding follow-up items. They are working with management to follow-up. The remainder of the report is informational.

Ms. Moss asked for questions. There were none. Tony added that their Internal Audit Charter will be updated and brought back to the committee.
